In consideration for RENT the parties promise and agree as follows:

2. **PROPERTY:** The **Lessor** hereby leases to the **Government** the following described property:

Exclusive use of a five (5) acre tract, more or less, of land in Labette County, Kansas, described as follows:

Beginning at the Northeast Corner of the Northwest Quarter, Section 25, Township 31 South, Range 19 East, thence South 545 feet; thence West 400 feet; thence North 545 feet, thence East 400 feet to point of beginning; as shown in Exhibit "A", attached and made a part of this agreement.

To be used for the following purpose: Governmental purposes.

- 3. <u>LEASE TERM</u>: The Lessee shall have the right to have and to hold the said premises, or any portion thereof, for the period beginning 1 January 2022 through 31 December, 2071.
- 4. **RENTAL:** The Government shall pay the Lessor rent at the following rate:

ONE DOLLAR AND NO/100 (1.00) per entire term, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged.

5. OWNERSHIP: The Lessor warrants that he is the rightful and legal owner of the property and has the legal right to enter into this lease. If the title of the Lessor shall fail, or it be discovered that the Lessor did not have authority to lease to the property, the lease shall terminate. The Lessor, the Lessor's heirs, executors, administrators, successors, or assigns agree to indemnify the Lessee by reason of such failure and to refund all rentals paid.

**6. EXCLUSIVE USE:** The Lessor shall not interfere with or restrict the Lessee, or its representatives in the use and enjoyment of the leased property, nor shall the Lessor erect any fence, wall, partition or any construction upon the leased, property except as otherwise agreed to in writing by the Lessee.

### 7. TERMINATION:

- a. The Lessee may terminate this lease at any time in whole or in part, by giving thirty (30) days' notice in writing to the Lessor. Said notice shall be the day after the date of mailing, or hand delivery.
- b. Termination in whole or in part shall be effective upon written notice, however, the parties may enter into a supplemental agreement to resolve certain issues arising from the tenancy and its termination, in whole or in part.
  - c. The Lessor has no termination rights.

### 8. <u>ALTERATIONS/RESTORATION/RELEASE OF LIABILITY:</u>

The Lessee shall have the right, during the existence of this lease, to make alterations, attach fixtures, and erect additions, structures, or signs, in or upon the premises hereby leased, which fixtures, additions, or structures, so placed in, upon or attached to the said premises shall be and remain the property of the Lessee and may be removed or left in place at the option of the Lessee. The Lessor hereby releases and forever discharges the Lessee, its officers, employees and/or contractors from any and all liability, claims or demands for site restoration of the leased premises.

- 9. <u>DAMAGES</u>: The Lessee shall not be responsible for combat or war related damages to the lease premises; the Lessee shall be liable only for damage resulting from negligence or misconduct of Lessee personnel. The Lessee shall not be liable for any loss, destruction or damage to the premises beyond the control and without the fault of negligence of the Lessee, including, but not limited to acts of nature, fire, lightning, floods, or severe weather. The parties agree that any settlement of damages by the Lessee if any, shall be done at termination of the lease.
- 10. <u>PROPERTY INVENTORY</u>: As of the starting date of this lease, a joint inventory and condition report of all personal property of the Lessor included in this lease, and also a joint physical survey and inspection report of the real property shall be made, said reports to reflect the then present condition, and to be signed on behalf of the parties.
- 11. <u>TAXES</u>: The Lessor accepts full and sole responsibility for the payment of all taxes and other charges of a public nature which may arise in connection with this lease, or which may be assessed against the property. This includes registration of the lease and payment of related charges.

- 12. NOTICE: Any notice under this Lease is to be given in writing and delivered by "Certified Mail, Return Receipt Requested" or registered mail, Express Mail or comparable service, or delivered by hand and delivery, whether accepted or refused, attempted delivery, or marked undeliverable, shall be deemed notice under the terms of this Lease. Any notice given by the Lessor to the Government shall be addressed to: District Commander, U.S. Army Engineer District, ATTN: Real Estate Division, RE-A Branch, 601 E. 12th Street, Room 602, Kansas City, Missouri 64106-2896. Any notice given by the Government to the Lessor or his/her agent shall be addressed to: Parsons, Kansas 112 S. 17th Street, Parsons, Kansas 67357 and e-mail parsonsks.com/city-commission, or as may from time to time otherwise be directed in writing by the parties. Both Lessor and Government have an obligation to ensure that the other party has their accurate address. Any such notice and correspondence shall include the lease number.
- 13. <u>LESSOR'S SUCCESSORS</u>: The terms and provisions of this lease and the conditions shall bind the Lessor, and the Lessor's heirs, executors, administrators, successors, and assigns.
- 14. <u>COVENANT AGAINST CONTINGENT FEES:</u> The Lessor warrants that no person or selling agency has been employed or retained to solicit or secure this lease upon an agreement or understanding for a commission, percentage, brokerage, or a contingent fee, excepting bona fide employees or bona fide established commercial or selling agencies maintained by the Lessor for the purpose of securing business. For breach or violation of this warranty the Lessee shall have the right to annul this lease without liability or in its discretion to deduct from the lease price or consideration the full amount of such commission, percentage, brokerage, or contingent fee.
- 15. OFFICIALS NOT TO BENEFIT: No Member of or Delegate to Congress or Resident Commissioner shall be admitted to any share or part of this lease or to any benefit that may arise therefrom, but this provision shall not be construed to extend to this lease if made with a corporation for its general benefit.

### 16. GRATUITIES:

- a. The Lessee may, by written notice to the Lessor, terminate the right of the Lessor to proceed under this lease if it is found, after notice and hearing, by the Secretary of the Army or his duly authorized representative, that gratuities (in the form of entertainment, gifts, or otherwise) were offered or given by the Lessor, or any agent or representative of the Lessor, to any officer, or employee of the Lessee with a view toward securing a lease or securing favorable treatment with respect to the awarding or amending, or the making of any determinations with respect to the performing, of such lease; provided, that the existence of facts upon which the Secretary of the Army or his duly authorized representative makes such findings shall be in issue and may be reviewed in any competent court.
- b. In the event this lease is terminated as provided in paragraph (a) hereof, the Lessee shall be entitled (i) to pursue the same remedies against the Lessor as it could pursue in the event of a breach of the lease by the Lessor, and (ii) as a penalty in addition to any other damages to which it may be entitled by law, to exemplary damages in an amount (as determined by the Secretary of the Army or his duly authorized representative) which shall be not less than three nor more that ten times the costs incurred by the Lessor in providing any such gratuities to an such officer or employee.

- c. The rights and remedies of the Lessee provided in this clause shall not be exclusive and are in addition to any other rights and remedies provided by law or under this lease.
- 17. **EXAMINATION OF RECORDS**: The Lessor agrees that any duly authorized representatives shall have the right until the expiration of three (3) years after final payment of the agreed rental, have access to and the right to examine any directly pertinent books, documents, papers and records of the Lessor involving transactions related to this lease.

## A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE COMPLETION OF AN APPLICATION TO THE KANSAS DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND ENVIRONMENT REGARDING A LOAN FROM THE KANSAS PUBLIC WATER SUPPLY LOAN FUND

WHEREAS, the City of Parsons, Kansas (the "City") is a duly incorporated city of the First class organized under the laws of the state of Kansas (the "State") which operates a public water supply and distribution system (the" System"); and

WHEREAS, the City Commission (the "Governing Body") of the City has heretofore determined in to be in the best needs of the customers of the System to undertake certain modifications and improvements (the "Project") to the System; and

(the "Act"), the Kansas Department of Health and Environment ("KDHE") administers the Kansas Public Water Supply Loan Fund (the "Fund") from which loans are made to certain qualified Municipalities (as said term is defined in the Act) to finance modification and improvements to public water supply systems; and

**WHEREAS**, the City has heretofore made an application to KDHE for a loan in an amount not to exceed \$324,156.00 (the "Loan") to finance the Project; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body has conducted a public hearing this date on the advisability of proceeding with the completion of the application for the Loan and desires to authorize the appropriate officials of the City to accomplish the completion process.

### BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF PARSONS, KANSAS, AS FOLLOWS:

**Section 1. Loan Application.** The Mayor of the City are hereby authorized to cause to be prepared and to execute a Loan Application, including all attachments thereto (jointly, the "Application"); in substantially the form presented to the Governing Body this date, in order to provide financing for the Project. The Application shall be forwarded to KDHE as soon as possible.

**Section 2. Further Proceedings.** The Mayor and the other officers and representatives of the City are hereby authorized and directed to take such other action as may be necessary to complete the Application and to coordinate processing of a loan agreement for the Loan (the "Loan Agreement"); provided that the authorization to execute the Loan Agreement shall be subject to further resolution of the Governing Body.

**Section 3. Further Authority.** This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption.
