**Information:** On December 19, 2022, Trekk Design Group, Inc. entered into an agreement with the City for Lead Service line Inventory for an amount not to exceed \$324,156.75.

The attached pay request is for Invoice No. 23-000202 for work completed through March 27, 2023 in the amount of \$31,105.81. And Invoice No. 23-000356 for work completed through April 21, 2023, in the amount of \$18,387.10. The total of both invoices is \$49,492.91.

D. 2023 Vehicle Bids (Pages 28 – 35)

**Information:** The original capital replacement schedule for the police department has been to purchase two new patrol vehicles each year for roughly \$112,000 fully equipped (emergency equipment, radio, vehicle camera and radar). The last new vehicles were purchased in 2020 (2 Ford SUV's + P/U) and 2021 (2 SUV's + 1 K-9 P/U), and 2022 (1 SUV + 2 used P/U's were purchased + used K-9 Dodge Charger). These vehicles have been

purchased to be 'patrol ready' with emergency lighting, radios, radar, and vehicle cameras professionally installed prior to delivery.

Currently the police fleet consists of 23 vehicles including 13 marked patrol cars, 8 unmarked assigned vehicles (3 detectives, COP/DC & 2 travel cars), the CSO truck and Command Post Truck.

The fleet has grown with detectives and specialized assignments that have come online, this includes two marked K-9 units and a Community Policing Officer assignment. Sgt's have assigned vehicles to be first responders from their residence (3 Sgt's, a 4<sup>th</sup> Sgt position is open), these assigned vehicles will greatly extend their life.

Currently seven (7) vehicles (2 Det, 4 patrol and 1 CSO truck) are off warranty and are at or over 100,000 miles (93,851 to 132,798 miles). Because of the delay between ordering and delivery of vehicles we are not surplusing any vehicles until delivery of 2024 model cars occurs.

**DISCUSSION/ANALYSIS:** Police patrol vehicles are the backbone for the delivery of policing services. But acquiring new vehicles is limited by the continuing short production runs of police vehicles produced by Ford, Dodge and Chevy. There is usually a short ordering window for delivery of these vehicles, which no longer follow a regular schedule. Delivery dates are currently not guaranteed and can stretch out to a year into the future after a purchase is made.

The 2023 model year ordering period closed months ago and production continued to be impacted. Consequently, there are only a few 2023 vehicles left in the hands of a limited number of dealers/outfitters. We believe that we can locate up to three (3) 2023 Ford SUV PPV vehicles through this bid.

The next order cycle for 2024-year model vehicles will start sometime in the next few months, specific dates have not been announced. It is anticipated that another bid for 2024 vehicles will come quickly, knowing that once an order is made with a short order window, delivery will not occur until well into 2024.

#### **BUDGET IMPLICATIONS:**

Funds for this purchase or lease-purchase will be drawn from the Safety Sales Tax Fund and has no impact on the City's General Fund.

As a side note, by converting this and all future police vehicle acquisitions to a government lease-purchase, we can use the same level of funding that we have used to buy 2 new vehicles annually to fund a police fleet that will last longer and provide a greater response capability to the City for special events, crime emphasis patrol, serious crime response/investigations and most importantly immediate deployment during natural or man-made disasters (ranging from tornados to haz-mat train derailments).

**Recommendation:** Authorize the City Manager to purchase or lease-purchase up to three (3) 2023 or newer Ford Police PPV SUVs for the Police Department.

# 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Commemorating Parsons Municipal Building Parsons, Kansas

WHEREAS May 1, 1923, marks the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Parsons Municipal Building's first City Commission Meeting with A. C. Hoke, Mayor presiding and F. W. Frye, City Clerk

WHEREAS the story of the Parsons Municipal Building began in 1917 after receiving a petition with 1251 names filed by the Greater Parsons Improvement Association calling for a bond issue. February 26, 1917, Mayor Leinbach passed Ordinance #2319 calling for an election to issue bonds not to exceed \$150,000.00 to construct and furnish city hall in the heart of Parsons, Kansas

WHEREAS the architectural firm of Thomas W. Williamson and Company was tasked with completing plans for the new facility.

WHEREAS bids for the newly discussed building were opened in the Mayor's Office in the Elks Theatre Building on April 24, 1922, and Peterson Construction Company, Salina, Kansas was awarded the low bid of \$114,850.00 and

WHEREAS the Parsons Municipal Building held the 2,100 seat Parsons Municipal Auditorium and throughout the 100 years was offices for all city departments as well as other services and was leased to Labette County for Court Services and rented to the School District for offices.

WHEREAS on August 2, 1922, an official cornerstone ceremony was held with Alfred Coad, Mayor, E. I. Holley, Commissioner, Henry Olen, Commissioner, and F. W. Frye, City Clerk present and featured on the cornerstone.

WHEREAS more than thousands of patrons have attended numerous events in the Parsons Municipal Auditorium, the first being Handel's Messiah on May 21, 1923, the grand opening of the auditorium. The Parsons Community Philharmonic Society, organized in 1922, was comprised of local citizens and had a 125-voice choir and 25-piece orchestra. They were the beginning of a "great community service movement in our city," of which continues 100 years later.

WHEREAS THE Parsons Municipal Building - along with the vision, work, and collective effort it took to bring it into existence - stands as a testament to the Parsons spirit and legacy of going after great things and working together to achieve them.

NOW THEREFORE, I Kevin Cruse, Mayor of the City of Parsons along with the Parsons City Commissioners do hereby commemorate this day, May 1, 2023, as the

and encourage all citizens and visitors to honor the contributions of past local leaders, who gave the best of their talents and energies to our community; to remember that the Municipal Building is the seat of city government that belongs to all people of Parsons, and to share in the excitement of our beloved city's future, knowing that many chapters in its story remain to be written, for generations and centuries to come.

Reissue Amended RFP to Replace Police Body, In-Car & Interview Room Camera Systems

Approved the rejection of the previously submitted proposals and authorized the re-issuance of a revised RFP for Police Body, In-Car, and Interview Camera systems.

Motorola purchased WatchGuard, which has been our vendor for police body, in-car, and interview room camera systems.

The police department capital replacement schedule had our nine (9) year old WatchGuard server on schedule to be replaced this current fiscal year. This server has experienced intermittent problems that have been temporarily fixed. When we contacted WatchGuard to price a replacement server, we were notified that because of the purchase of the company by Motorola the WatchGuard line was being terminated. We were told that our equipment warranties were void and that replacement equipment under the WatchGuard brand was no longer available.

We were told that we should migrate to Motorola products.

Other police departments have experienced the same problem, and many have purchased other hardware and software, surplusing their WatchGuard equipment. This includes the Lawrence Police Department, Newton Police Department, and others. Other agencies may have more time to convert or migrate to Motorola or other vendors, we are tied to how long a faltering server will continue to operate while knowing that as equipment reaches the end of its useful life it will not be repairable or replaceable.

The twenty-seven (27) body cameras except for a couple are already seven (7) years old which is the manufacturer's maximum product life for the units. The in-car units total fifteen (15) and range from three (3) to seven (7) years of age and the interview room units are newer.

A Request for Proposals was created and sent to vendors with a due date of March 6, 2023. Only three (3) proposals were submitted with total costs listed below:

Staff evaluated the proposals and felt that the proposals exceeded a reasonable cost and recommend that the proposals be rejected.

#### **INFORMATION:**

A new round of RFP's has been prepared with modifications. If necessary, the interview room systems could be purchased separately in the future as a cost savings measure.



#### **BUDGET IMPLICATIONS:**

When a vendor is selected the purchase is of a significant amount that it can be funded using a government lease-purchase covering the warranty period of the hardware (usually five or 7 years), using Public Safety Sales Tax revenue. An outright purchase is not feasible using currently available general fund resources.

## Rescind the August 15, 2022, City Commission Approval of the Alquist 3D, LLC Free Land Program Application

Commissioner Bolinger moved, Mayor Cruse seconded to rescind the August 15, 2022, City Commission approval of the Alquist 3D, LLC Free Land Program Application. On August 15, 2022 the City Commission approved Alquist 3D's application for all remaining lots available in the City's Free Land Program, which was approximately 13 lots. To date the property has not been transferred to Alquist 3D and Alquist 3D has not made any request for the property to be transferred to them. Pursuant to the Free Land Program regulations, Alquist 3D had 120 days to begin construction on a home although at the time, City Staff did indicate it would be willing to be flexible on the 120 deadlines to account for the scope of the project and the winter weather. Based on the fact Alquist 3D has not made any further request for the land to be transferred and the guidelines of the Free Land Program have not been complied with, City Staff is requesting the City Commission vote to rescind the August 15, 2022 approval of Alquist 3D's Free Land Program application. #### Purchase of 2023 John Deere Gator

Commissioner Shaw moved, Mayor Cruse seconded to approve the purchase of 2023 John Deere Gator. On April 3, 2023, the City Commission approved the purchase of a Kubota side by side vehicle in the amount of \$21,582.22 through a dealer located in Southeast Kansas and priced through Sourcewell contract pricing. This agreement did not work out.

Heritage Tractor, Pittsburg, Kansas has a 2023 John Deere Gator XUV865R in stock at a cost of \$31,983.75, including a three (3) year powertrain warranty. This is the government pricing, to the public the cost would be approximately \$39,000.00. Staff had a demonstration and found this to be a much higher quality piece of equipment. This is an increase of \$10,401.53. The funding for the purchase would be \$5,000.00 from the Tourism Fund, as this will be a great asset to the upkeep of the trails and trails are a large part of tourism in Southeast Kansas. The balance of \$26,983.75 would be paid by sales tax funds. Approved on roll call. Shaw – yes; Crooks – yes; Bolinger – yes; Strait – yes; Cruse – yes.

#### Information:

The original capital replacement schedule for the police department has been to purchase two new patrol vehicles each year for roughly \$112,000 fully equipped (emergency equipment, radio, vehicle camera and radar). The last new vehicles were purchased in 2020 (2 Ford SUV's + P/U) and 2021 (2 SUV's + 1 K-9 P/U), and 2022 (1 SUV + 2 used P/U's were purchased + used K-9 Dodge Charger). These vehicles have been purchased to be 'patrol ready' with emergency lighting, radios, radar, and vehicle cameras professionally installed prior to delivery.

Currently the police fleet consists of 23 vehicles including 13 marked patrol cars, 8 unmarked assigned vehicles (3 detectives, COP/DC & 2 travel cars), the CSO truck and Command Post Truck.

The fleet has grown with detectives and specialized assignments that have come online, this includes two marked K-9 units and a Community Policing Officer assignment. Sgt's have assigned vehicles to be first responders from their residence (3 Sgt's, a 4<sup>th</sup> Sgt position is open), these assigned vehicles will greatly extend their life.

Currently seven (7) vehicles (2 Det, 4 patrol and 1 CSO truck) are off warranty and are at or over 100,000 miles (93,851 to 132,798 miles). Because of the delay between ordering and delivery of vehicles we are not surplusing any vehicles until delivery of 2024 model cars occurs.

**DISCUSSION/ANALYSIS:** Police patrol vehicles are the backbone for the delivery of policing services. But acquiring new vehicles is limited by the continuing short production runs of police vehicles produced by Ford, Dodge and Chevy. There is usually a short ordering window for delivery of these vehicles, which no longer follow a regular schedule. Delivery dates are currently not guaranteed and can stretch out to a year into the future after a purchase is made.

The 2023 model year ordering period closed months ago and production continued to be impacted. Consequently, there are only a few 2023 vehicles left in the hands of a limited



number of dealers/outfitters. We believe that we can locate up to three (3) 2023 Ford SUV PPV vehicles through this bid.

The next order cycle for 2024-year model vehicles will start sometime in the next few months, specific dates have not been announced. It is anticipated that another bid for 2024 vehicles will come quickly, knowing that once an order is made with a short order window, delivery will not occur until well into 2024.

#### **BUDGET IMPLICATIONS:**

Funds for this purchase or lease-purchase will be drawn from the Safety Sales Tax Fund and has no impact on the City's General Fund.

As a side note, by converting this and all future police vehicle acquisitions to a government lease-purchase, we can use the same level of funding that we have used to buy 2 new vehicles annually to fund a police fleet that will last longer and provide a greater response capability to the City for special events, crime emphasis patrol, serious crime response/investigations and most importantly immediate deployment during natural or man-made disasters (ranging from tornados to haz-mat train derailments).

#### Ordinance No. 6535, Special Use Permit

#### **Information**

The Planning Commission conducted a Public Hearing on April 18, 2023, on the request for a Special Use Permit for the construction of a 180' utility tower for WIFI internet. The request from the property owner is due to the height of the pole being taller than 60'. The vote was in favor of approving the Special Use Permit as presented.

#### **Action Requested**

Adopt Ordinance No. 6535 and authorize Mayor's signature.

#### **ORDINANCE NO. 6535**

AN ORDINANCE APPROVING A SPECIAL USE PERMIT TO ALLOW A 180' UTILITY TOWER IN THE A-1 AGRICULTURAL DISTRICT ON CERTAIN PROPERTY LOCATED IN THE 3-MILE EXTATERRETORIAL AREA OF THE CITY OF PARSONS, KANSAS, UNDER THE AUTHORITY GRANTED BY THE ZONING REGULATIONS OF THE CITY AS ORIGINALLY APPROVED BY ORDINANCE NO. 5957.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF PARSONS, KANSAS:

SECTION 1. Having received a recommendation from the Parsons City Planning Commission, and proper notice having been given and hearing held as provided by law and under authority and subject to the provisions of the Zoning Regulations of the City as originally approved by Ordinance No. 5957, a special use is hereby approved to allow a 180' Utility Tower in the A-1 Agricultural District described as follows:

Beginning 40' W of the Southeast Corner of the W½ of the SE Quarter of Section 9, Township 31 S, Range 20 E, Thence N 254.5'; Thence W 286' Thence N 522.5', Thence W 376', Thence S 777' to the Section Line; thence E along the Section Line to the Point of Beginning, Labette County, Kansas (Zachary & Lorrie Hill, Owner/Petitioner) – 1770 25000 Rd.

Such special use is subject to the following condition(s): N/A

SECTION 2. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage, approval, and publication once in the official city newspaper.

I. Chairman Sharon Kendrick called the Parsons Planning Commission meeting to order and led in the Pledge of Allegiance. A quorum was determined by roll call.

- II. Richard Babcock moved to approve the agenda as presented. Lowell Wells seconded the motion. Voting on roll call, Kendrick Yes; Wells Yes; Gross Yes; Babcock Yes; and Holsteen Yes. Motion carried.
- III. Ron Holsteen moved to approve the minutes of the Parsons Planning Commission/Board of Zoning Appeals meetings held March 21, 2023. Lowell Wells seconded the motion. Voting on roll call, Kendrick Abstain; Wells Yes; Gross Yes; Babcock Yes; and Holsteen Yes. Motion carried.
- IV. Planning Commission New Business
  - A. A Public Hearing was held on the request for a special use permit for the construction of a 180' Utility Tower for wireless internet on property zoned as A-1 Agricultural District described as follows:

Beginning 40' W of the Southeast Corner of the W½ of the SE Quarter of Section 9, Township 31 S, Range 20 E, Thence N 254.5'; Thence W 286' Thence N 522.5', Thence W 376', Thence S 777' to the Section Line; thence E along the Section Line to the Point of Beginning, Labette County, Kansas (Zachary & Lorrie Hill, Owner/Petitioner) – 1770 25000 Rd

Mr. Hill stated this is an internet tower for broadband internet and it's because in our area we don't have good internet. There's only two ISP providers, Winexus and Wave Wireless, and neither one of them has a tower close to us, and so both have about the same service. For years we have complained and lots of the neighbors have complained, and this is a tower that everyone in the area is going to be able to use. It will have an antenna on it that belongs to WINEXIS and anybody that wants to have access to highspeed broadband internet for the first time northeast of Parsons.

Mr. Hill owns the property and is leasing the tower to Winexus and they will remove the tower if the lease is terminated. It's 180' tall, guyed tower, but it won't be tall enough to require lights. Mr. Hill said everyone will be able to use it for business, education, personal use, whatever. Mr. Hill said if the tower fell it would not hit any structure, but maybe a shop building that he owns. Access would be off 25000 Rd and will use the driveway that goes to his shop building.

Chairman Kendrick opened the public hearing for comment. Debora Wolverton who lives across the road and wondered if there was any chance it would interfere with any other services? Is it a health hazard? Mrs. Wolverton thought the tower was going to be closer to the neighbor's house

who was trying to sell it and felt bad for the owners. Will Winexus ever go to fiber optics or are they staying with tower systems?

David Semrad, part owner of Winexus, stated the tower will be a guyed tower and it should not have any effect on any of your services or satellite services. "Mr. Semrad stated that basically Winexus and Wave Wireless have been competitors for 17 years. Wave Wireless started in Parsons and Winexus started in Galesburg area and now we both share in Parsons, St. Paul, Erie, Thayer, and Galesburg. There has never been any hostility between us. The way wireless internet works is it's an unlicensed frequency and there is a band of frequencies that is used, and we just works out the frequency usage. It's not like cell phone companies who buy millions of dollars of licensed frequencies, and they are the only company who can use them. Mr. Semrad stated it is to our benefit to work together with other unlicensed frequency businesses."

Mr. Semrad said as far as the tower, the location if it would fall, which it won't because of how it's built. It's an engineered kit to stay up and we have over done it by cementing it into the ground and if the tower falls over it won't hit any structure except the possible exception of Mr. Hill's shed. As far as a health hazard, it's wireless signal and the government regulates the power output so no there's not any health issues. The tower size is 16" triangle wide and the range will be approx. 10 miles but would be subject to trees and hills in the way.

Roger Thompson owns a farm nearby and the internet is terrible, and it would be a benefit to have the service upgraded in that area.

Chairman Kendrick asked if any ex parte contact or communication had been reported, none received. Laura Moore read the factors as part of the evaluation of the special use request, and the Board agreed with the factors read.

Richard Babcock moved to make the recommendation to the City Commission to approve the Special Use Permit as requested. Ron Holsteen seconded the motion. Voting on roll call, Kendrick – Yes; Wells – Yes; Gross – Yes; Babcock – Yes; and Holsteen – Yes. Motion carried.

- V. Lowell Wells moved to recess the Parsons Planning Commission Meeting and convened the Board of Zoning Appeals Meeting. Ron Holsteen seconded the motion. Voting on roll call, Kendrick Yes; Wells Yes; Gross Yes; Babcock Yes; and Holsteen Yes. Motion carried.
- VI. New Business Board of Zoning Appeals
  - A. A Public Hearing was held on the request for a front-yard construction of a front porch on property zoned R1- Single-Family Residential District described as follows:

     Lots 3-4, Block 20, Belmont Addition, City of Parsons, Labette County, KS (Christopher Stringer, Owner/Petitioner) 3008 Morgan

Ronnie Stringer stated that the porch would be centered with the front door, and the porch roof will only cover the porch area, does not include the steps and will be open all around the porch area without railing. The porch will be 8' tall.

Chairman Kendrick opened the public hearing for comment, none received. Chairman Kendrick asked if any ex parte communication or contact had been reported, none received. The Public Hearing was closed to review the standards in Article 10 Section 107 D 1-2. Laura Moore read each standard and the Board agreed this request met the requirements.



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Lowell Wells moved to approve the front-yard variance as requested for the construction of a front porch. Ron Holsteen seconded the motion. Voting on roll call, Kendrick – Yes; Wells – Yes; Gross – Yes; Babcock – Yes; and Holsteen – Yes. Motion carried.

B. A Public Hearing was held for a front-yard variance for the construction of a carport on property zoned R1- Single-Family Residential District described as follows:
 E50' Lot 7 & W40' Lot 8, Block 169, Parsons 3<sup>rd</sup> Addition, City of Parsons, Labette County, KS (Varvel, Owner/Petitioner) – 1205 Morgan

Gary Varvel stated that he would like to build a 18'x16' carport to park his vehicles under. The carport would be attached to the house under the drip edge of the existing roof, all open with a metal roof, trim, and secured on 4"x4" treated posts. Mr. Varvel stated that the basketball goal will be relocated.

Chairman Kendrick opened the public hearing for comment, none received. Chairman Kendrick asked if any ex parte communication or contact had been reported, none received. The Public Hearing was closed to review the standards in Article 10 Section 107 D 1-2. Laura Moore read each standard and the Board agreed this request met the requirements.

WHEREAS, the evidence supports the finding that said structure(s) is unsafe and dangerous.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF PARSONS, KANSAS the structure(s) located on the real estate above described is unsafe and dangerous.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF PARSONS, KANSAS THAT SAID STRUCTURE SHOULD EITHER BE REPAIRED OR CONDEMNED.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF PARSONS, KANSAS, that said structures shall be repaired or removed and the premises made safe and secure. Said repair or removal shall be diligently pursued by the owner until the work is completed. The deadline to obtain all necessary permits for such removal or repair is May 20, 2023, or in the event the owner fails to diligently pursue the same, the Governing Body of the City of Parsons, Kansas will cause the structure to be razed and removed and all costs assessed against the property as provided by law.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF PARSONS, KANSAS that upon the removal of the structure, all basements or excavations located on the premises shall be filled, and the owner-occupant shall take all other action necessary to leave such premises in a safe and secure condition.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution shall be served on the owner, lienholder, agent and occupant of said structure as provided by law.
